FRANCES MALLET



*It is with the sincerest regret that the Georgia Historical Society announces the passing of **Frances Mallett**, Monday, September 14, 2015. She was the wife of Peter S. Mallett, founder of the Georgia Historical Society, on March 14, 1975.*

Peter has often praised Frances for the enormous assistance she provided him in his dedicated work in research, collections, and education related to Georgia's history. She co-authored several of his books, as well as proofreading, utilizing her great education regarding her library and literature expertise. Frances served as the Georgia librarian from 1957 to 1967.

Peter so prized Frances' assistance in all of his endeavors regarding Georgia's history that he dedicated one of his most esteemed compositions, "The History of Georgia, Vermont", Volumes I and II, to her.

Frances designed and planted the present Georgia Municipal Building and Memorial gardens after the building's construction in 1989. These works of devotion to her town are only a sample of the many efforts and kindnesses provided by Frances – way too many to name all!

It was because of her constant devotion to and love of her town of Georgia and its community that the Georgia Historical Society continues, today.
